Dear Parents and Pupils,

Welcome to a new year at Stewards Academy. On page 3 you will find a list of the teaching staff for reference.

#### **GCSE RESULTS 2016**

Congratulations to last year's Year 11 students on achieving some outstanding examination results. Stewards improved on previous performance with 55% achieving GCSE's A\*-C with English and Maths.

Overall students made significant progress Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 4. Our top 5 performing students achieved on average 2 grades higher than expected in each of their GCSE's. The top ten students achieved 90 A\*-A grades between them. My thanks to all the staff who have worked hard to support students achieve their goals.



### INCLUSION QUALITY MARK (IQM)

In July we hosted a visit to review our IQM status and have since received a very positive report from the assessor.
