Dear Parents and Pupils,

As part of numeracy week pupils in years 7, 8 and 9 took part in various numeracy activities, games and competitions in lessons and during registration.

During registration years 7 & 8 pupils attempted the "Four 4's" challenge, this involved working out how to make each number from 1 to 100 using four 4's and any mathematical operators. Pupils were very enthusiastic to find the answer. Prizes for the most correct answers were awarded to tutor groups 7GM and 8MT.

Year 7, 8 and 9 pupils were also looking for numeracy in their lessons. The first pupil to spot numeracy in a lesson was given a golden ticket, which could then be exchanged at maths club for a small prize. Progress Report December 2011

The Gravity Racer Project progresses well thanks to the enthusiasm of our team (James Mallardo, Chris Wilson, George Wilson, Jordan Huntley, Tom Gibbs, Ryan Freeman and Tom Dowers). Various aspects of the project are under way with some nearing completion and others about to start. We have tested the painted chassis with full suspension and wheels (and brakes) which have been removed again so that the ultra thin plywood body can be formed round the chassis. This nears completion prior to preparing for painting. Artwork options have been projected onto the bodywork using an overhead projector and a design agreed. The web page is under construction and our sponsorship group are considering options while the journalists are concocting a press release.

'GALAXY ZOO', INSTITUTE OF PHYSICS EVENING LECTURE

Presented by Dr Stuart Lynn, University of Oxford Venue: Cavendish Laboratories, University of Cambridge

Exploring the Moon, keeping the Earth safe from harmful solar radiation, searching for planets around other stars, taking a voyage on the great battleships of World War 1 and helping to understand the climate better are all activities which sound a million miles away from what most of us do day to day. BUBBLES: TRICK OR TREAT, IOP EVENING LECTURE

Presented by Dr Gianluca Memoli

On the 13th October, 11 pupils from Stewards visited The Cavendish Laboratories in Cambridge. The aim of the visit was to see a lecture about bubbles by Dr Gianluca Memoli. We arrived in good time and were ushered into the lecture theatre and shown where to sit. The students were excited to see the size of the lecture hall, with the rows of seats and the big screen down at the bottom.

Dr Memoli was very entertaining and funny. He told us about some of The Guinness World Records on bubbles and then demonstrated by attempting to put some of the audience inside a bubble! We also learnt that bubbles can be used to treat cancer, by injecting them into the blood and targeting ultrasound waves at them so that they penetrate the cell membrane and burst, releasing drugs, which then destroy the cell.

Dr Memoli also discussed the use of bubbles in food and drink and how they can alter the flavour and texture. He taught us that there is a relationship between bubbles expanding and collapsing and the sound they make. This is why a bottle of fizzy pop hisses when you open it and this is the noise we hear as the tide goes in and out and waves rush up and down the beach. He gave many more examples of bubbles found in nature and how scientists have applied this knowledge to come up with new and exciting solutions for problems faced by astronauts, the fashion industry and general society. The students really enjoyed the demonstrations and were involved in one of them when they demonstrated to the rest of the audience, the noise you get when you open a bottle of fizzy pop!

Alex Dodd 8MT : 'It was a good experience; very educational. I learnt a lot of new things about bubbles. I also now look at things in a completely different way.'



Your Majesty

I have watched the annual Remembrance Day Service on television today with huge pride and emotion, as I have done for many years. I thought it entirely appropriate therefore to tell you about a very special event which took place at my school, Stewards Academy in Harlow on Friday 11th November. As an historian I wanted to acknowledge the significance of the 11.11.11.11 ceremony, and as such I organised a whole-school ceremony which will long live in the memories of everyone who was there. We had 20 Second World War Veterans with us along with representatives from our local business and education community, serving members of the armed forces, police, fire service and the District Commissioner for Scouting in Harlow. The Chairman of the Royal British Legion in Harlow led our service and we were very proud to have several standards on display. Every member of the school community who belonged to the Scouts, Guides, Army Cadets, Air Cadets, Sea Cadets, St John Ambulance Service or Salvation Army wore their uniform to the ceremony with great pride. A total of approximately 1,200 children and adults stood in our outside area in a quadrangle decorated with poppies, flowers and garlands, and in actual fact on a cold, drizzling November 11th they stood in absolute silence for 25 minutes. The Last Post and Reveille were played by staff, the Exhortation and the Kohima Prayer were read and the entire school body sang the National Anthem. Year 7 and 8 pupils then dropped poppies from the balcony onto the people below.

The feedback from the day was overwhelming.

Mica Peters in Year 8 said "Thank you so much; we are so grateful to you for fighting for our country. Your sacrifice of 'your today for our tomorrow' is so appreciated. We will always remember this, for what you have done. Every year we have Poppy Day; the 2 minutes are for you and for what you did for us. We will remember."

Luke Pykett in Year 11 said "Today's ceremony was very special as it was on 11.11.11.11. It was quite a special moment of my life being part of such a ceremony. When the poppies dropped I felt such emotion hit me. My granddad is a Chelsea Pensioner and both of my great-grandparents were Japanese prisoners of war."

Jake Murphy in Year 11 said "After today, I'm proud to be English. I have never felt a feeling like I did today. The feeling is most likely pride and I think it has been a really good day and I'm glad I played my part in the 11.11.11.11 celebration. When I saw the War Veterans I said forget Steven Garrard and Wayne Rooney ... these men are the real heroes."

Riley Halson in Year 8 said "After today I have many precious memories that will be passed down from generation to generation."

Head Boy Jack Baldwin said "I think that today sums up Stewards – it will be a moment I will remember for the rest of my life. I can remember walking onto the balcony and thinking 'Wow' at how the entire school was standing. A fantastic day."

The last words go to the War Veterans themselves.

Leslie Dunn, who has the Military Medal said "An excellent service, a pleasure to be involved."

92 year old John Mead said "It was marvellous, the best service that I have ever seen. The school should be very proud of themselves the way they respect the day and the old folk, very special to see in this day and age."

And Bill Martin, ex parachute regiment said "I have never attended a function so well organised. The welcome given to the Veterans has been quite overwhelming. The children are a credit to the school."

'Buzz', another Normandy Veteran said **"This special day was very well organised, I give 10 out of 10.** The staff were great, the students were so well behaved, today to me was a great success. To come to Stewards is always a pleasure, long may it continue."

Altogether it is a day I am hugely proud to have organised. In my 37 year teaching career there are now 2 high spots – receiving my MBE from you last November for services to education, and commemorating Armistice Day in November 2011 at Stewards Academy.



Dear Parents/Guardian.

RE: FREE SCHOOL MEALS.

We are currently reviewing our Free School Meals records. As part of this review we are asking that all families read the eligibility rules below and complete the reply slip overleaf.

Eligibility rules are – Parents or guardians receiving Income Support or Jobseekers Allowance (income based) or Child Tax Credit with an annual taxable income of less than £16,190 or the Pension Guarantee Credit are eligible to claim for Free School Meals. However, if any amount of Working Tax Credit is received by the parent or guardian the child is not eligible for Free School Meals.

It is very important that we have an up to date record of the number of pupils who are entitled to a free meal. This has a significant impact on the amount of funding that the school receives for books, computers and other resources for your child and this could become even more important in the future because of budget cuts in Education.
