MISS MARTIN

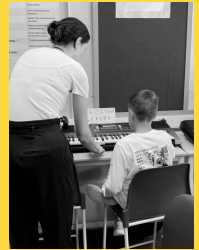

AFRICA FASHION EVENT

Year 9 is such an important year for Stewards pupils as they get to think about their future careers and where they would like to focus their interests. Throughout this year, the pupils on this course showed hard work, dedication, and success within DT (particularly Textiles), and to reward their attitude to learning, we offered them the opportunity to visit the Victoria & Albert Museum which is renowned for their excellent education facilities.

The irresistible creativity, ingenuity and unstoppable global impact of contemporary African fashions were celebrated in an extensive display of garments, textiles, personal testimonies, photographs, sketches, film, and catwalk footage in this exhibition. Many of the garments on show hailed from the archives of iconic mid-twentieth century African designers and alongside these were personal insights from influential contemporary African fashion creatives, as well as highlights from fashion trends of the day, which were on display for the first time.

During the trip, pupils were able to activate their creativity, draw and take notes to incorporate into any GCSEs within Art, DT or Textiles. The colours were bold, and the exhibition was big so there was lots to amaze! 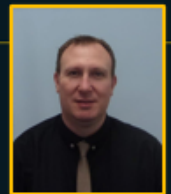

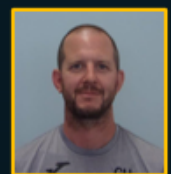
