We hope you had an amazing evening year 11! See you on results day!

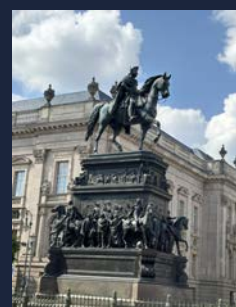
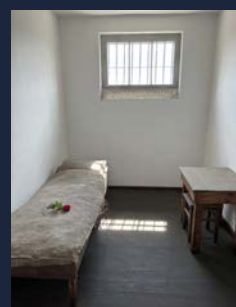

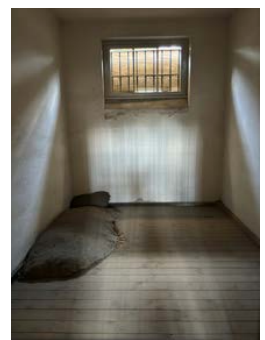


Year 10 History Students Visit Berlin

In Stewards Academy's first international trip since Covid, 32 Year 10 History students departed for the German capital of Berlin just before May half-term, buzzing with excitement. The 2am start did not phase them, as we raced to Heathrow to catch the flight. Mr Hawk led us expertly throughout the trip, and was tag teamed with our wonderful tour guide Garry, who we met as we arrived at our hotel. Our first stop after dropping our bags was Alexanderplatz, which became a consistent base for us throughout the trip with its plethora of food and shopping options. After refuelling, we departed onto our first walking tour, taking in some of the most famous sights of the city such as the Brandenburg Gate, Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe and the Reichstag.

After an early night and a good night's sleep, an hour's journey outside the city found us at Sachsenhausen Memorial, located where the first concentration camp was in Nazi Germany. This was a moving and powerful experience; to stand where those who perished in the Holocaust once were, with Garry talking us through the journeys they would have experienced. We returned to the city for lunch at Hackeshermarkt, followed by another brief tour to see Neue Synagogue and children's memorial, and ending at the Palace of Tears - a former border control office turned into a museum about the Berlin Wall. Another museum followed, the fantastically interactive DDR Museum which showed life behind the Wall in East Berlin and East Germany. We then sat down at Der Alte Fritz for a well deserved three course meal, including a traditional German schnitzel main, which left us all feeling satisfied before heading back to the hotel.





Saturday brought another packed day, starting at the impressively preserved Stasi Prison Museum. Guided by locals, we were taken through the various interrogation rooms, prison cells, and courtyards that would have had thousands of political prisoners passing through in the 1930s and 40s. After lunch back at Alexanderplatz, and battling the brutal heat, we headed to the Berlin Wall Memorial, and were told of the various attempts at crossing the wall Berliners attempted, even seeing the remnants of the tunnels that were dug in desperation. As the sun continued to beat down on us, Mr Drew provided the group with much needed ice cream as we returned once again to Alexanderplatz to ascend the TV Tower. At 368 metres, it is the tallest structure in Germany, and gave us incredible panoramic views of the city we now felt we knew well. I think every one of us on the trip felt that this was a city that we would never forget visiting.

However, after one last sleep, our time in Berlin was up. After a short look round the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church, we said our goodbyes to Garry, thanking him for his brilliant guidance, and departed to the airport. After a slight panic and rush to make the plane, and subsequently being held on the runway for over an hour, we made it back to the UK safely and smoothly.

This was a fantastic experience for students and staff alike, and all credit is due to Mr Hawk for planning and leading the trip, with invaluable assistance from Mr Meehan, Mr Drew and Mrs Sturman.

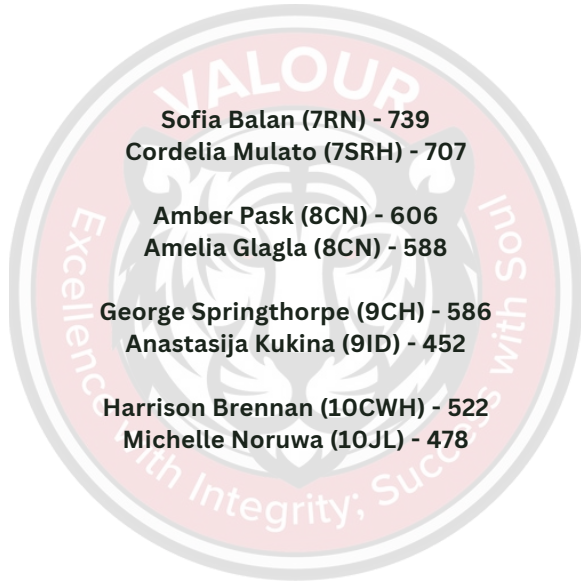

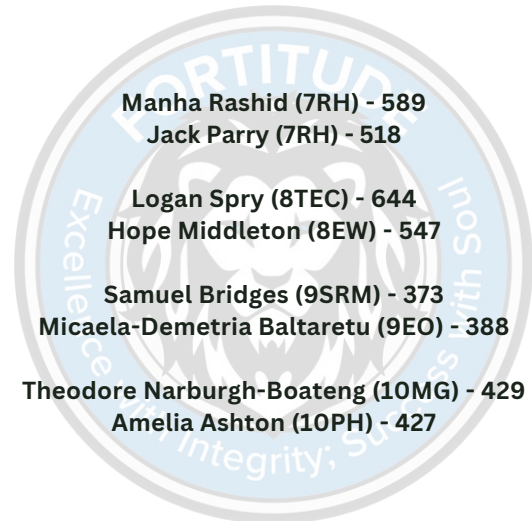

Solutions For The Planet Regional Final

Before half term, some of our year 8 and 9 pupils attended the 'Solutions for the Planet' Regional Final at the University of East London. Their presentations were incredible and as a result, our year 9 team qualified for the National Final. This means they will present their sustainable business idea at the Science Museum in London at the end of this month. Congratulations!



Solutions For The Planet National Final

In June, our year 9 students participated in the National Final for Solutions for the Planet which took place at the Science museum in London. It was a fantastic experience which resulted in a Special Commendation from the judges, who appreciated the sustainable business idea created by our pupils. The idea consists of a bike (BioBike) which uses kinetic energy to create electricity to charge household items. Our students received support from Tarmac mentors and even fitness celebrities such as Emily Chan, who came up with suggestions and live feedback on their business plans. The Science Museum was a great venue to hold the final and we very much enjoyed having a look around. This year there were 3000 students from all over the country who submitted a business idea to S4TP but only 40 of them made it to the final. This is a huge achievement for our pupils.



HARLOW & WEST ESSEX DISTRICT ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS



Stewards Academy were represented at the Harlow & West Essex District Athletics Championships held at Chelmsford Stadium. Stewards had one of the smallest teams in the competition with the students competing against thirteen other schools across the whole district. They managed to punch above their weight to come 6th overall and in 2nd position in Harlow.

The Year 10 team were also being assessed for their GCSE PE athletics performances. They will now be using their practical performances on the day for their evidence and will also be using Stewards Sports day to try to hit their targets.

For the Year 10 team Joey Bromley came 2nd in the Javelin event and Kamal Ricketts came third with a well timed run for the 800m. Guoda Juozapaityte came 3rd in the Long Jump event and Poppy Andrews came third in the Triple Jump event.

Other standout performers on the day were Emetas Bliedzis whose throw won the shot putt for year 8 and would have also won the year 9 event. Joshua Odumosu in year 7 came away with a bronze in the shot putt. Freddie Travers-Knott in year 8 was runner up in the Javelin and Jesse Ciantar in year 9 came away with a bronze in the Javelin event.

It was fantastic to see all the year groups supporting each other and cheering them on in their events and there was a great team comradery shown by Stewards. Lots of our athletes showed great resilience and determination to keep going in the heat and they did themselves credit not only with their performances but also their great behaviour. We couldn't have been more proud of you all for your fantastic performances on the track and also for your conduct in the stands.

Year 6 Taster Day 2024



On Thursday 27th June Stewards Academy were delighted to host a very exciting Taster Day for our new Year 6 intake joining us in September. 210 pupils joined us across the day from a variety of schools and pupils took part in a range of activities including English, Maths, Science, Technology, PE, Art, Modern Foreign Languages, Geography, History and the Performing Arts.

In the morning, pupils took part in a formal assembly with their new year group, enabling pupils to meet key staff, learn about the school's values and expectations and understand the structure for the day. In the afternoon, all pupils came together to watch a Performing Arts Showcase and were treated to a wonderful array of Music and Dance Performances by our highly talented cast of Year 7-10 Performers. The show went down a storm with our year 6 pupils, with many of them clapping, cheering and singing along throughout the performance, and the atmosphere across the afternoon was electric!

During the day, pupils went off in their new Tutor groups with Year 9 prefects to experience a small 'taste' of a variety of subjects that they will study in September. In English pupils learnt about 'Riddles' and explored various descriptive techniques, adjectives and imagery. In Maths, pupils were taught about 'Tangrams' and investigated different shapes, sequences and patterns. In Science, pupils learnt about properties of water and the meaning of density, and experimented layering rainbow-coloured floating liquids in a test-tube, as well as building and launching hydro rockets. In Technology, pupils took part in a variety of hands-on activities including making shortbread in Food Tech, creating felt collages in Textiles, observing the safe use of large machinery in Wood Tech and creating a health and safety poster on the use of the equipment observed. In Art, children learnt about 'Typography' and created their own name places in this style. In Geography, pupils were introduced to the topic of 'Around the World' and participated in an interesting Atlas activity. In Modern Foreign Languages, pupils had to recite the names of animals in French/Spanish and participated in various fun and interactive online games. In History, pupils got to explore Roman Mosaics, and in P.E, pupils got to let off steam in a fun and engaging game of Rounders.

The year group behaved impeccably throughout the day and the level of effort and work produced was truly outstanding! Year 6 really did step up to the mark throughout this experience and made an excellent 1st impression on all of the staff that had the privilege to work with them on the day. Well done Year 6 for your positive attitudes and contributions throughout the day. You are a credit to yourselves and a credit to your current school and family. We really look forward to welcoming you into the Stewards family in September!

Safeguarding

This half term, we have continued to focus on kindness, acceptance, and the power of our words. We ran a series of anti-bullying workshops which fed into this beautifully and they were well-received by students.

Online safety - summer campaign - The summer holidays are fast approaching and while more time may be spent outside away from screens, it's important to remember that the risk of online harm and child exploitation doesn't disappear.

Parents and carers should remain aware of their child's internet use over the summer - as much as any other time of year. Child exploitation and grooming often starts with contact on social media. Any child is at risk and it's important to remember that both boys and girls can be groomed.

The ESCB website has resources for parents, carers and professionals including podcasts, videos, how to report concerns and information about spotting the signs of exploitation.- ESCB - Online Safety

Help children to stay safe online by creating a supportive environment - Caregivers can create a supportive environment, where online safety is discussed regularly in the same way as road safety or stranger danger, enabling children to speak up about any concerns they may have. By taking an interest in what games they are playing and trying to understand their online world, parents and carers can initiate important conversations. It's also worthwhile double checking that devices have the correct parental controls, especially if they're new.

The Essex Safeguarding Children Board website has resources for parents, carers and professionals including podcasts, videos, how to report concerns, and information about spotting the signs of exploitation.

It is important to remember that exploitation is not the child's fault, and they are never to blame. Concerns about child exploitation can be reported anonymously by calling Crimestoppers on 0800 555111.

There is also a dedicated Essex Police Child Exploitation hotline for parents, carers and members of the public to seek advice on concerns they may have about their own or other children with regards to criminal and sexual exploitation. Call 01245 452058.

As we go into our last week of the academic year, we wish all of you a safe and happy summer break. Please remind your young people to be mindful of their conduct when they're out in parks, etc.

Remember that social spaces are there for people of all ages to feel safe and enjoy, so appropriate behaviour and consideration are very important. Please have conversations about safety around railways, power lines and water.

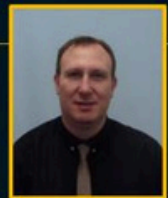

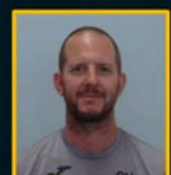
