Jeans for Genes day took place on Friday 18th September and with over 700 staff and pupils participating we raised the brilliant sum of £356.90!

This amazing success was followed by the MFL department's Great European Raffle! Over recent years we have had the highly popular Great European Bake Off! to promote European Day of Languages and to raise money for Macmillan Cancer Support. As we've had to do things differently this year the raffle turned about to be a great alternative.

The MFL team created three beautiful hampers filled with delicious treats and a cookbook; one each of Italian, French and Spanish. The hampers generated a lot of interest and the charity team raised the excellent amount of £485.50 to go the charity.

Open Day videos



We had to find an alternative way for pupils and staff to showcase our fantastic academy this year, as we were unable to hold our annual Open Day and Open Evening— one of the highlights of the year. In discussion with colleagues and the Student Leadership Team, we decided to offer a series of videos involving new pupils from Year 7; School Council members from Years 8-10; members of the Year 11 Student Leadership Team; and lots of staff. It was great to have over 60 pupils involved and to listen to what they have to say about life at Stewards Academy.

Pupil Survey

Listening to what the pupils have to say is an important factor of academy life and even more so at the present time. Our first pupil survey of the year generated a 60% response. Questions focused on how they feel they have settled back in following our return, what they are most proud of so far, their target for the year, if they feel they need additional support, and what in-house 'fun' activities they would like to do in place of the normal range of trips and activities we offer. The top three included; non-uniform day, film afternoon, tutor activities. We will be looking to see what we can offer as rewards later in the term and will be following up with any pupils that have said they need support in a particular area.



Year Council meeting

There was a brilliant turn out at the first Year 7 Year Council meeting with 70 pupils from all tutor groups keen to get involved more in academy life. This meeting was particularly looking at logistics and finding out whether pupils were keen to be involved in the discussion aspect of meetings, charity or community work. Regular commitment to Pupil Voice activities stand pupils in good stead for future positions of responsibility—including the School Council.

The first of our Year 7 community work helpers are now working on a rota in the dining room and with litter picking. This team will be expanded after half term. I look forward to our next meeting.

School Council and Student Leadership Team

The teams have been off to a great start this year and adapting to our current 'normal'. We have had to reconsider how we are able to run meetings and communicate regularly; pupils are certainly rising to the challenge. What has been wonderful to see is so many wanting to get involved in our videos at the start of term, followed by charity work and now the community work, where there is an opportunity to prefect in the canteen and help with litter picking.



It makes me very proud to know so many pupils in the academy community want to help and support the staff in these areas and take on the responsibilities involved. These volunteers are buying in to our newly launched **Phoenix Challenge** and will receive positive points and other recognition certificates or letters for their records of achievement.

Pupils participate in regular meetings and I look forward to more of these as we move through the year.


