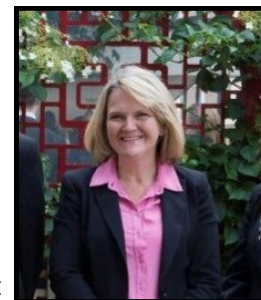

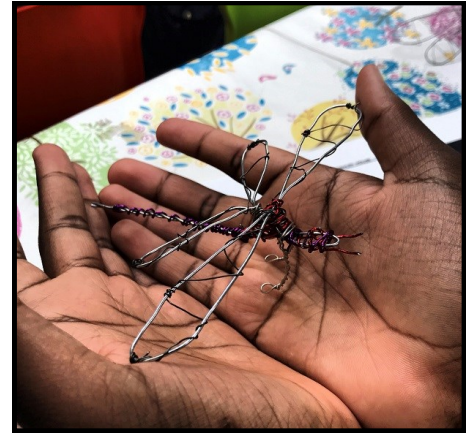

Art and Photography Trip



On the 17th of June, Stewards Academy was able to take its first cohort of students on a trip for the first time since the pandemic began. It was a very exciting time for students, being allowed out for the day for their Art and Photography studies. The weather had been wonderful, and we were all excited for a day in the sun! Alas, the weather had changed and as we prepared for the worst in full on waterproofs, we were lucky to be greeted with warm cloudy weather and absolutely no rain!

It was the perfect day! Year 10 immersed themselves in their surroundings and were soon deep within the Sculpture Garden and Garden of Surprises (which as the students discovered... did have a few surprises!). Burghley boasts beautiful architecture, is one of the largest and grandest surviving houses of the sixteenth century and a magnificent example of the great Elizabethan 'prodigy' houses.

As beautiful as the house is... our adventure took us to the Garden of Surprises and the Sculpture Park. "The innovative sculptures are both loaned and commissioned and often take their inspiration from the house and the context of the gardens. The works are displayed alongside sweeping borders, diverse plantings and broad drifts of wildflowers".

An absolutely brilliant day was had by all, with the students being an incredible credit to the school! It was an absolute pleasure to take this cohort of students for our first trip back to launch their new project "Natural Forms".

MFL Cultural Food Event



This half term, the MFL Department arranged a cultural food event to celebrate the hard work, dedication and commitment shown by the Year 11 students over their 5 years of studying French/Spanish. The event brought the French and Spanish language, culture, and cuisine to Harlow for the day, right on our doorstep!

Spanish students were offered a range of paella dishes to try including *paella de marisco* (seafood paella), *paella de pollo y chorizo* (chicken and chorizo paella) and *paella de verduras* (vegetable paella).

French students were treated with both a savoury crêpe including *les crêpes au fromage* (cheese), *au jambon* (ham), *aux champignons* (mushroom), *aux tomates* (tomato) and a sweet crêpe including *les crêpes au sucre et limon* (sugar and lemon), *au banane* (banana), *au Nutella*. With the highlight being the “Sunday Ripple” that consisted of *framboise*, *chocolat blanc*, *Biscoff*, *et fraises* (raspberry, white chocolate, Biscoff and strawberry).

Whilst enjoying the authentic food on offer, students also had the opportunity to practise their speaking skills by conversing with the catering staff in the target language. The catering staff were impressed with the level of confidence and enthusiasm shown by the students.

Students were also given the opportunity to listen to a range of French and Spanish music whilst they enjoyed the food. Not forgetting taking fun photos using our French and Spanish props!

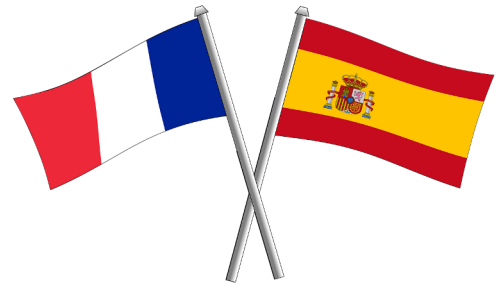

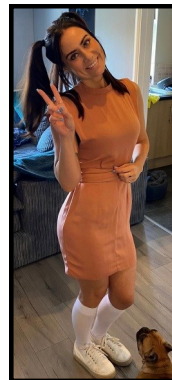
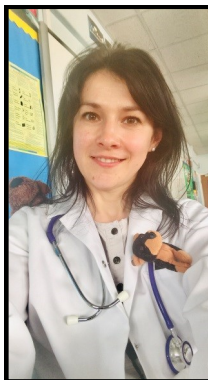
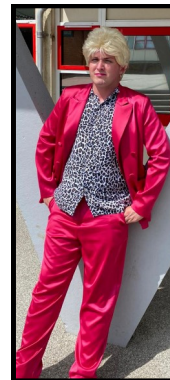
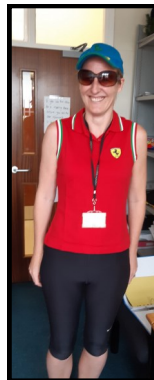
All staff entries were awarded with House points that count towards the end of year total.

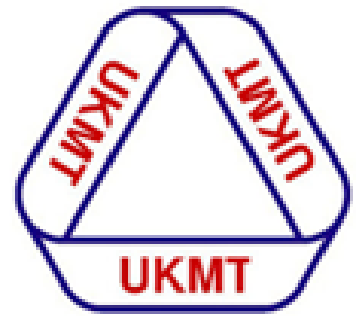


UKMT Junior Mathematics Challenges

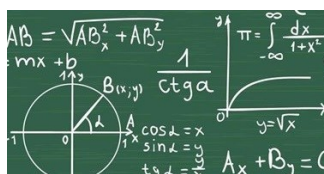

Show Racism the Red Card



Two Stewards Academy students win national School Art Competition.

Hardson Palmer, aged 16 and Tiana Hyder, aged 13 from Stewards Academy are two of the winners of the annual Show Racism the Red Card School Competition.

The Competition has been running for 22 years and has become the biggest equalities competition in the UK with over 23,600 entrants this year from more than 340 schools.

The Competition is free to enter for all young people of school age, and divided into artwork, creative writing and multimedia categories.

Hardson is a winner in the Year 10+ Category and Tiana is a winner in the Years 7 to 9 Artwork Category. They both also won separate memorial awards. Hardson had his artwork selected by Stuart Lawrence, brother of Stephen Lawrence for the Stephen Lawrence Foundation Memorial Award and Tiana was selected by Julia Regis, widow of Cyrille Regis for the Cyrille Regis Memorial Award.

Their work will feature in the 2022 Show Racism the Red Card Calendar and they will receive prizes from Kickers/ Pentland, EA SPORTS, Hunter Boots & Usborne Publishing.

We are also indebted to Competition sponsors UNISON, the National Education Union, Unite the Union, the PFA, Potts Print UK and the FA.



Show Racism the Red Card is the UK's largest anti-racism education charity and is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year. Since its inception in 1996, they have educated and engaged with over 825,000 people.

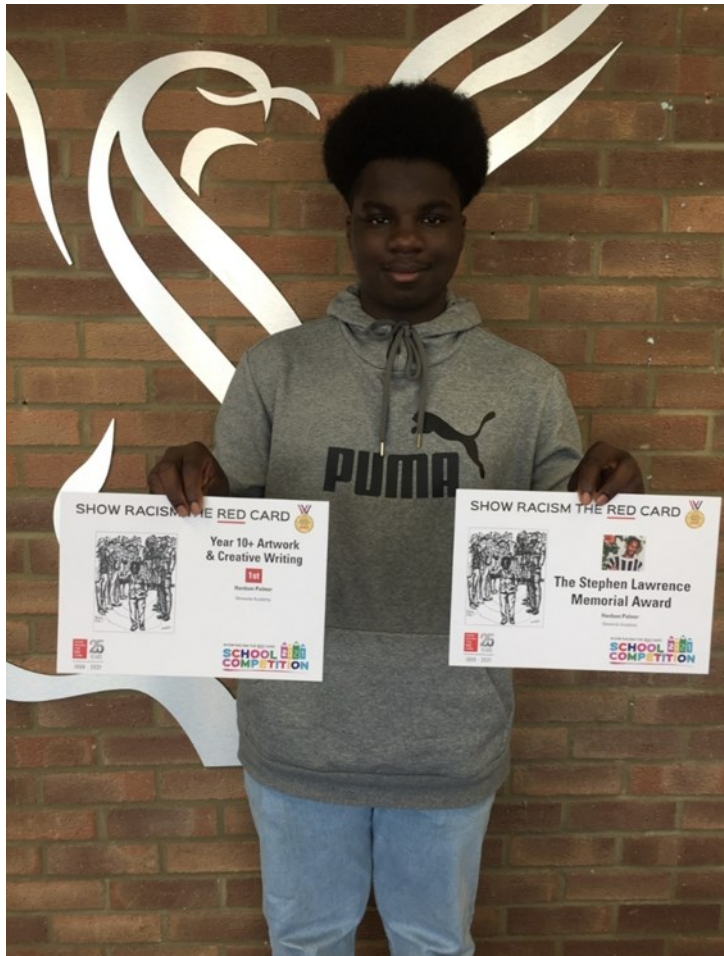

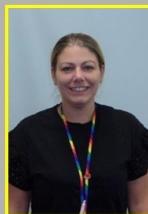
