As we move into the second half of the school year and hopefully some warmer weather I would like to take this opportunity to thank you the students and you as parents for your continued support with regards standards and expectations across the academy. It has been a pleasure working with the student council to ensure that as a school we continue to grow and develop.

As you will be aware various structures and systems have been reviewed and adapted based on the feedback that we receive from our students and parents.

A couple of these are outlined below.

Plans for a new dining facility are in the process of being designed and we hope that this new facility will be open in the new academic year.

New interactive display screens have been installed in all classrooms across the school to support Teaching and Learning across the Academy.

Other less grand but no less important initiatives have seen key changes to support standards across the Academy

A review of the school's behaviour systems with the introduction of tighter sanctions and community correction for students that are unable to follow expectations during their social time.

LEARNING AT STEWARDS

It may be chilly outside, but the Stewards community continues to fight off the winter blues with its dynamic and exciting educational experiences.

In our recent Ofsted recent inspection, Inspectors commented on the pupils and their experience in the classroom:

'Pupils are friendly and welcoming. In lessons, they work hard and focus well. This creates a positive environment for them to learn.'

Part of our active teaching and learning strategies has focused on the quality of delivering an excellent curriculum. This was highlighted a number of times in the Ofsted report:

'Teachers teach the curriculum well. They plan learning that considers carefully how to build pupils' subject knowledge.'

Over the past few years, we have had a laser sharp focus on student retrieval and retention of learning.

'When teachers introduce new content, pupils can link it to what they have learned before. Teachers check pupils' learning effectively.'

At Stewards, we continue to focus and underline the importance of reading. This leads to academic success and is crucial in the modern world. The inspectors saw a huge amount of evidence of this during lessons:

'Leaders and teachers have made sure that all pupils become fluent readers. Pupils choose from a wide variety of books to read for pleasure. Pupils read literature regularly in lessons. Less-confident readers get the support they need.'

The report also praised our extra-curricular ('Phoenix' programme):

'Leaders challenge pupils to show the school's 'courage' values when they join clubs and activities.'

It is vital in this post pandemic era that we promote positive attitudes to exercise which in turn helps us all to be mentally better balanced and prepared for the demands of modern life.

Teachers continue to use their time freely to support student progress outside the curriculum. Y11 students have the opportunity to access a wide range of revision sessions in numerous subjects. The next Y11 PPEs begin after half term. Please can I encourage you to ensure that your child attends and makes the most of the opportunities that are on offer to ensure examination success. The revision schedule has been shared with the students and is also available on the school website.

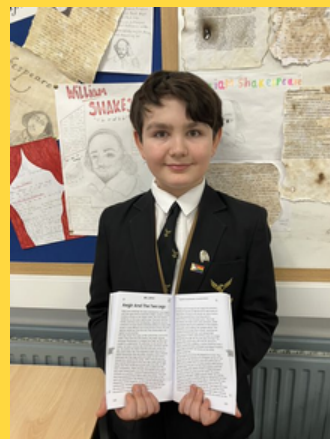

In KS3 Food and nutrition is delivered as part of the technology rotation. Pupils have the opportunity to develop their cooking skills using a range of techniques to produce healthy dishes using staple ingredients provided by the school. They can personalise their dishes using seasonings, spices and additional ingredients.

The rotation includes theory lessons that build their knowledge around the topic of healthy eating, food and the environment, and food safety and security.

In KS4 pupils can elect to take Hospitality and Catering as a Level 2 Vocational option. Learning more complex preparation and cooking skills from a range of cultures. This culminates in a three and a half hour cooking exam which forms a percentage of their final grade.

In theory lessons pupils gain an understanding of the operations of the hospitality and catering sector, which employs one in twelve people in the UK.

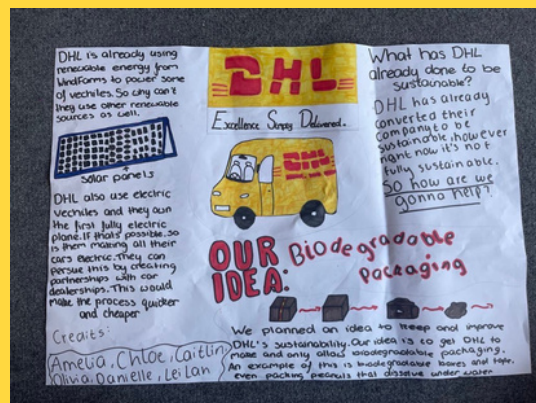
A good result can support entrance to college courses in the subject, leading to university degrees and a range of careers, including; Executive Chef, Hotel manager, nutritionist, event manager, food scientist, army catering, Environmental Health Officer, and the opportunity to run your own business.

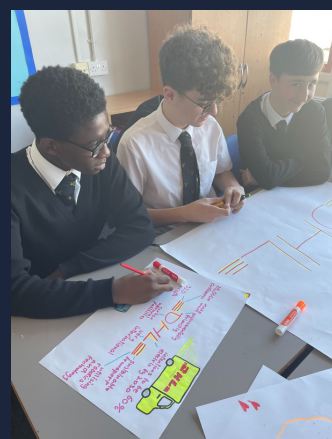
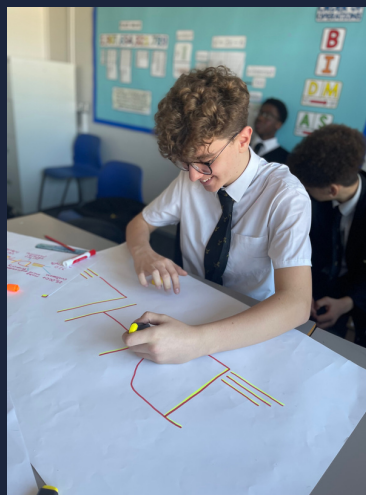

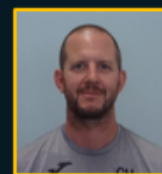
